#### **G. DESCRIPTIVE REPORT:**

### 01. General Observations / Remarks of the Project on:

#### 1.1. Background:

The Project area is dispersed at Komorpur to Shara-Jhaudia (Km. 0.000 to Km. 6.620) in Upazila Ishwardi, Dist. Pabna & Tilokpur to Gouripur (Km. 0.000 to Km. 0.965) in Upazila-Lalpur, Dist. Natore from left bank erosion of the Padma river. Komorpur and Shara-Jhaudia area important business centre in the region which contribute socio-economic enhancement in the areas. Said areas were under severe threat from left bank erosion of the Padma River.

River erosion occurred since 2003 at said vulnerable location and at pre-project time erosion trend had been devastating with resultant loss of huge immovable properties and human hazards. Besides Rajshahi to Ishwardi road via Lalpur in the area became endangered due to continuous erosion of the river. In this situation, road communication of 4-5 union under Ishwardi Upazila was threatened to be disrupted due to river bank erosion. During monsoon of 2007 & 2008 erosion trend became most devastating and it was apprehended that erosion would be increased further in ongoing monsoon season.

In the above circumstances, it was necessary to initiate immediate protective measures against river erosion at this vulnerable area. Otherwise various important establishments located in the vicinity of the area were threatened to be engulfed into river. There was a long standing social demand for safety of lives & properties against river erosion hazards. In this backdrop, the project had been formulated to protect erosion by constructing 7585 meter bank revetment works along left bank of the Padma River.

The local people of the area requested frequently BWDB officials to take necessary steps to implement the project with a view to protect the valuable Govt. and other properties, lives of animals, lands in the project area. To solve the problems of river erosion, the present Honourable Prime Minister of The People's Republic of Bangladesh, Sheikh Hasina on her visit to Natore at Kanaikhali Field on 11st December, 2011 made a commitment to implement the project with sustainable solution of the problems. As the project was in threat from the river erosion, Honourable Minister, Ministry of Planning requested to the Honourable Minister, Ministry of Water Resources to take immediate erosion mitigation measures. Honourable Member of the Parliament, Pabna-4 also requested to implement the project.

To implement the project all physical items of works had been incorporated as per recommendation of report of the technical committee.

### 1.2. Justification / Adequacy:

The project is justified as the background stated above prompted BWDB to take up the project for implementation. Moreover, it was Honourable Prime Minister's committed project.

#### 1.3. Objectives:

- The main objective of the project is to protect left bank of the Padma River from Komorpur to Shara-Jaudia (Km 0.000 to Km. 6.620) in Ishwardi Upazila under Pabna Dist. & Tilokpur to Gouripur (Km. 0.000 to 0.965) in Lalpur Upazila under Natore District by constructing Bank Revetment work.
- Protect the Project area from Erosion of the Padma River.
- To safeguard vast irrigable lands potential for agricultural production as well as valuable establishments like Ishwardi Airport, EPZ, Railway campus in the area from devastating erosion of the river Padma.
- To reduce environment degradation due to river erosion in the area and provide stable environment for development in the areas adjacent to protected river bank.
- To save huge public and private properties dispersed around the said erosion prone area with approximate total worth of Tk. 86529.00 lakh.

#### 1.4. Project revision with reasons:

DPP of the project of costing Tk. 22020.66 lakh had been approved by the ECNEC meeting held on 05-02-2013. The approval on the DPP was circulated by Planning Commission vide memo No. 20.00.0000.411.14.04.13-95 date: 11-04-2013 and the administrative approval issued by the Ministry of Water Resources vide memo No. 42.041.014.01.000.039.2011-36 dated: 28-04-2013.

The bank revetment work of 7.585 Km of the Project is divided into 20 (Twenty) packages. Cost estimate of bank revetment work was prepared on the basis of approved design and Standard Schedule of Rates of Pabna O&M Circle, BWDB, Pabna of FY 2012-2013. The rate of supplying empty Geo-bag was increased due to change of Geo-bag size. Due to the increased rate of Geo-bag, the project cost was increased from Tk. 22020.66 lacs to Tk. 22604.91 lacs. Hence 1st revision of the DPP was approved. Administrative approval of the 1st revised DPP was issued by the Ministry of Water Resources vide memo No. 42.041.014.01.00.039.2011-34 dated: 05-02-2015.

Originally the project implementation period was from January, 2013 to June, 2015. It was not possible to commence physical works of the project during the financial year 2012-13 & 2013-14. So, it was not possible to finish tendering process for all packages and implement total physical works within 2014-15. Consequently, no cost time extension was approved and project implemention period was revised from January, 2013 to June, 2017. The administrative approval for time extension of the project was issued by the Ministry of Water Resources vide memo No. 42.041.014.01.00.039.2011-162 dated: 18-08-2015.

As per decision of meeting of  $7^{\rm th}$  steering committee, re-appropriation of the project had been done. Accordingly the re-appropriation of DPP had been approved by MoWR.

## 02. Rationale of the project in respect of Concept, Design, Location and Timing:

Bangladesh is a riverine country and bank line erosion of different rivers has been a recurrent occurence. River bank erosion in alluvial lands of Bangladesh is a complex and dynamic thrust of nature due to strong onrush of water and major variation in between normal water flow and surges of inflow during monsoon & post-monsoon period in each year. The monsoon discharge of the major rivers was so large that there was recurrence of floods every year. Sometimes it became very severe and caused immense damages impacted by occurrence of devastating river erosion. This had significant social and economic impacts. The loss of land, crop and property had led to landlessness.

The large seasonal variation in river flow resulted in varying sediment transportation capacity and caused river-bank erosion, migration of river-bank and meandering river channels. Recent Satellite Image studies of the Ganges-Brahmaputra-Middle-Meghna rivers show that 1, 06,300 ha. of land were lost to erosion, while only 19,000 ha. were accreted over the period 1982-1992. The net area of 87,000 ha. lost to erosion is equivalent to an annual erosion rate of 8,700ha.

In this context, there had been growing concern and reassessment of the economic and socio-political benefits of protecting important towns, infrastructure, hats and bazaars as well as agricultural land. The issue had been given due importance in the national planned documents for water sector and prioritized strategic location of river banks had been stressed for phased implementation of river bank protection programme at the apex level. The overall objective of the project was to safety of lives & properties around the area. Throughout the

erection of proposed bank revetment work, safety of vast tract of agricultural lands and other immovable properties total worth of Tk. 86529.00 lakh be ensured against river erosion.

The construction work components had been incorporated in the DPP in accordance with approved design & drawing by Design Circle-II of BWDB at DPP preparation time, but on working time, all design of the works reviewed on the basis of latest river morphology, location and time. DPP have also been reviewed by 1st revision of the DPP.

upazilla areas from the left bank erosion, "Protection of the Left Bank of Padma River from Komorpur to Shara-Jhaudia in Ishwardi Upazila under Pabna District and Tilokpur to Gouripur in Lalpur Upazila under Natore District" project was approved in ECNEC held on 05-02-2013. After the successful implementation of this project, the project area has been protected from severe erosion of the river Padma.
